Professor Danny Quah was born in Malaysia and is now a British citizen. He holds degrees from Princeton and Harvard. He was Assistant Professor of Economics at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology before joining the LSE and was the first Head of Department for Economics at LSE (2006 - 2009). He was a member of the Steering Committee at Confucius Institute of Business London; the Co-Director at LSE Global Governance, London School of Economics; Council Member at Malaysia's National Economic Advisory Council; and a Visiting Professor at the Tsinghua University School of Economics and Management. Prof Quah was also a member of the World Economic Forum Global Agenda Council on Economic Imbalances. He has consulted for, among others, the World Bank, the Bank of England, and the Monetary Authority of Singapore.

Prof Quah was panelist on Sustaining Asia's Competitiveness at the Tianjin 2010 World Economic Forum Summer Davos Annual Meeting of the New Champions. He spoke on the global economy and global imbalances at the Khazanah Megatrends Forum, the Hay Literary Festival, the British Embassy in Beijing, the National University of Singapore, Nanyang Technological University, Xinhua News Agency in Beijing, and the Shanghai Futures Exchange, and in different forums in Bali, Abu Dhabi, Kazakhstan, and Mauritius.

Prof Quah's research is on the global economy, economic growth and development, income inequality, international economic relations, economic geography and new technologies. He is investigating, in particular, the eastwards drift of global economic activity, and the implications of such ongoing shift. He has also worked in time series econometrics, inflation, and business cycles.
