Former OCBC chairman Tan Chin Tuan passed away yesterday

Former OCBC chairman Tan Chin Tuan passed away yesterday. He was 98.

A pioneer of OCBC, Tan Chin Tuan retired from the bank 22 years ago and was made its honorary life president.

According to a Straits Times report, Tan Chin Tuan became unwell last Sunday and was admitted into the Singapore General Hospital the following day. He remained in the intensive care unit till Friday, when he regained consciousness and asked to be discharged from the hospital.

Back home, he appeared relaxed and even did simple exercises on the bed. However, he lost consciousness again yesterday, and was admitted into the hospital.

Tan Chin Tuan joined the Chinese Commercial Bank as a clerk when he was 17. He was promoted to managing director of OCBC in 1942 and became its chairman in 1966.

Although he had retired from the bank in 1983, Tan Chin Tuan remained committed to charitable causes. In March this year, he donated \$29 million to the National University of Singapore to help elevate the quality of education and research at NUS. It remains the largest individual donation received by NUS to date.

Three years ago, Tan Chin Tuan also donated \$2.25 million towards the redevelopment of Anglo-Chinese School (Barker Road). He was an ACS alumnus, having completed his elementary and secondary education at ACS.

Tan Chin Tuan left behind two daughters, eight grandchildren and eight greatgrandchildren. His wife and only son had passed away.

His funeral will be held on the 17th November (Thursday). The cortege will leave for the Mandai Crematorium for funeral service at 11.45 am.
