From junior clerk to corporate chieftain

1908: Born in Singapore and educated at Anglo-Chinese School

1925: Became a junior clerk with the Chinese Commercial Bank (CCB)

1932: Became assistant manager of CCB before CCB merged with Ho Hong Bank and Oversea-Chinese Bank to form Oversea-Chinese Banking Corporation (OCBC)

1933: Made bank manager of OCBC

1939: Became managing director of Eastern Realty, an OCBC subsidiary. Over the years, he also became chairman of several big names in local business such as Raffles Hotel, Fraser and Neave, Malayan Breweries, Robinsons, Straits Trading, Great Eastern Life and Wearne Brothers

1939-1941: Served as Municipal Commissioner of Singapore

1942: Became youngest managing director in banking history when he was appointed joint MD of OCBC at age 34

1948-1955: Served as a member of the Singapore Executive Council; senior member and subsequently deputy president of the Singapore Legislative Council

1966: Took over sole control of OCBC as chairman and managing director

1969: Decorated Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire for his public service; also conferred the title of 'Tan Sri' by the Malaysian king Yang Di Pertuan Agong

1983: Retired as OCBC chairman and made honorary life president

1983 to 1986: Chairman of the Singapore Turf Club

1991: Conferred honorary doctor of law degree by National University of Singapore

1992: Retired as chairman of GE Life and Straits Trading
