The Tan Chin Tuan Foundation was established in Singapore by the late banker and philanthropist Tan Sri (Dr) Tan Chin Tuan (1908 – 2005) in 1976.

Tan Sri Tan believed in leading a happy and purposeful life, and in sharing the rewards of a highly illustrious career with those less fortunate.

He reached out to the deserving and supported charitable causes, which helped to improve society.

Upholding our founder's giving philosophy, the foundation supports causes and initiatives that are viable, sustainable and well-managed with definable social outcomes, taking into account evolving social needs.

CLEAR AND MEASURABLE OUTCOME TO BENEFIT MANY



Chairman's Message

In the three years from 2016 to 2018, the foundation continued to deepen the nature of our support to organisations in the social service space, by connecting groups to one another.

We worked with the Esplanade to provide *angklung* classes for the elderly and to invite the senior citizens from different charities to Mother's Day concerts with their loved ones at the Esplanade Concert Hall.

The latter was part of the Tan Chin Tuan Centennial Concert Series, which was started in 2008, the Birth Centennial Year of the founder, to spread the joy of music to charities. For many beneficiaries, it was also their first time at the Esplanade for a concert. We were glad that the level of community engagement was high. To see people from all walks of life, and especially seniors who lived alone or in rental flats, coming out to enjoy an outing was satisfying.

Helping needy undergraduates fulfil their educational aspirations was a priority for us. The foundation gave more to support deserving students through scholarships. From 2017, new undergraduate Tan Sri (Dr) Tan Chin Tuan scholarships were made available at the Singapore Institute of Technology.

Also, the foundation cast its net to reach out to past and present scholarship recipients. In 2018, we initiated a reunion with recipients of the Tan Chin Tuan Medal, an education award started by my father in 1959 for the top students at Anglo-Chinese School, now Anglo-Chinese Junior College. The cosy gathering over lunch at the conservation house of the Tan Chin Tuan Mansion, which was home to Tan Sri Tan, brought back memories of their schooldays, and served to bring the different generations together.

Where possible, we participated in discussions on topical issues by convening stakeholders in the public, private and philanthropic networks. In 2017, we invited Singapore's Speaker of Parliament Tan Chuan-Jin to a discussion on corporate and social services.

The foundation's philanthropic footprint in ASEAN is modest but gratifying. We supported healthcare missions to neighbouring countries, such as Cambodia, Myanmar and the Philippines. I volunteered as an ophthalmologist on these charitable missions.

We live in turbulent and fast-changing times, but the foundation strives to assist where we can, hoping to touch others through acts of assistance and kindness.

CEO's Message

YAP SU-YIN

In 2017, the Tan Chin Tuan Foundation (TCTF) marked its 40th anniversary since Tan Sri (Dr) Tan Chin Tuan established his family foundation in 1976 with the foresight that it would be a way for his family to rally their resources for the betterment of society.

Compared to the 1970s, Singapore has become more affluent. Its nationals are global citizens who have access to education and jobs. Year on year, donations to charitable causes increased, indicating a more generous population. There are now over 2,200 registered charities serving diverse causes.

Still, there is more to be done. As the foundation's council members constantly remind the team: How can we stretch the donation dollar for more impactful outcomes? In what ways can we deepen our relationships with our grant recipients? Where can we catalyse goodwill, nurture networks, aggregate resources strategically? With whom can we co-curate partnerships to empower positive change?

Education plays a big part. As a "Benefactor", TCTF established new scholarships at the Singapore Institute of Technology, so that in just three to four years, capable undergraduates from humble backgrounds who may have studied at ITE and polytechnics, could graduate with a tertiary degree and start earning degree-level salaries, thus turning their families' financial challenges around in just one generation.

We believe in empowering people to become partners. As an "Aggregator", our role entails coalescing resources towards issues that face the less privileged, so that positive change can take place and snowball. At the Singapore Management University (SMU), undergraduates can apply their skills in fundraising, digital marketing and hone their business acumen as part of a new initiative funded by the foundation, called the SMU-TCTF Summer Attachment and Industry Learning (SAIL) Programme. The students' attachment to social service organisations, which kicks off in 2019,

present opportunities to deepen their understanding of working in Singapore's non-profit sector.

We are heartened when positive impact cascades and brings sustainability. At Yong-en Care Centre, a charity located in Chinatown, the internship programme funded by TCTF seeded positive outcomes, when two interns progressed to become staff. They now contribute to this charity's mission of helping the elderly afflicted with dementia, as well as supporting children and families in need.

Where are the storms in people's lives? Where can TCTF continue to serve, and be of comfort to those in need? Responding to a donation appeal from St. John's Home for Elderly Persons, where the elderly residents were doing all they could to raise funds for a new sheltered home, TCTF stepped up to help by funding a new clinic, which will be part of the Home's efforts to offer better healthcare to its frail residents.

2017年，陈振传基金会已经成立了40周年。早在1976年，丹斯里陈振传博士创办了这个家族基金会，远见卓识地为他的家族提供了这个集结资源以改善社会的途径。

与20世纪70年代相比，新加坡变得更加富裕。其国民是获得教育和就业机会的全球公民。对慈善事业的捐款逐年增加，表明新加坡人更加慷慨。现在全国有超过2,200家注册慈善机构为各种慈善事业提供服务。

当然，社会上还有很多需要。陈振传基金会的理事会经常以如下问题提醒整个工作团队：我们如何才能更好地使用每新元的善款以获得更具影响力的成果？我们在哪些方面

可以加深与受惠者的关系？我们怎样才能重塑人们的生活，使他们的生活更加有意义和尊严？我们在哪里可以催化善意，建立关系网络，战略性地聚合资源？哪些人可以和我们成为共同策划地合作伙伴关系，以促进积极的变革？

教育占本基金会慈善事业中的很大一部分。在新加坡理工大学（SIT）新设立丹斯里陈振传博士奖项，目的是在短短三到四年内，能够使那些通过工艺教育学院（ITE）或者理工学院路径求学的学子，就是那些虽然背景卑微却有能力的学子获得高等教育，并赚得学位水平的薪资收入，从而在他们这代人身上改变家庭的经济困难状况。

本基金会相信要赋予人们能力成为合作伙伴。作为“聚合者”，我们的角色就是在少有特权的事务上整合资源，为要促成积极的变化并让善行滚雪球式增加。在新加坡管理大学 (SMU)，我们启动管理大学-陈振传基金会 (SMU-TCTF) 暑期额外行业学习计划。作为基金会资助的新计划之一，本科生可以在其中将他们的技能应用于筹款、数字营销和磨练他们的商业头脑。从2019年开始，那些慈善受益人的学生们，我们提供给他们加深理解对在新加坡非营利行业工作的机会。

看到积极的举措继续传递，我们备受鼓舞。在位于牛车水的永恩关怀中心，我们赞助种子基金的实习项

目取得显著成效。两名实习生逐渐成为员工。他们现在为这个慈善机构的使命贡献力量，帮助罹患老年痴呆症的老人，并支持需要帮助的儿童和家庭。

人们生活中的暴风雨在哪里发生，陈振传基金会岂不是在哪里提供安慰吗？圣约翰老人之家提出捐款呼吁，他们需要善款建造新楼，陈振传基金会就及时提供帮助，资助其中的新诊所，以便满足老人之家中那些虚弱老人的医疗需要。陈振传家族中第三代的投资人影射了他们的祖辈的善行。将近50年前，陈振传和他的夫人普安斯利陈海伦也向圣约翰老人之家提供援助，那时他们的需要是扩建设施以接纳更多贫困老人。

Tan Sri (Dr) Tan Chin Tuan was an avid advocate of life-long learning. The foundation continues his passion to raise the quality of research and education through professorships, scholarships, bursaries, supporting strategic programmes at the varsities and by encouraging knowledge-sharing among various educational institutions.

At tertiary institutions such as the National University of Singapore (NUS), Nanyang Technological University (NTU) and Yale-NUS College, the foundation’s endowments have supported several sterling programmes. These include the Tan Chin Tuan Professorships, Exchange Fellowships, Executive Leadership Training Programmes and Lecture Series. Over time, these programmes have strengthened the capability of local universities to advance the standard of research and to attract foreign research talent for the benefit of Singapore and the community.



Tan Sri (Dr) Tan Chin Tuan was a passionate advocate for life-long learning. The foundation has continued his legacy in supporting this cause.

The Tan Chin Tuan Foundation bestows a range of scholarships and academic awards to recognise the achievements of bright, deserving students of exemplary character, conduct and academic achievements.



Tan Sri Tan set up several scholarships at the Anglo-Chinese Schools (ACS). He named them after esteemed educators, who made significant contributions to ACS, so as to honour their memory.

In 1998, Tan Sri Tan established the Puan Sri Helene Tan Chin Tuan Scholarship at the Methodist Girls' School (MGS) to commemorate his wife's dedication to her family and society.

In 2019, MGS started to revamp its Puan Sri Helene Tan Chin Tuan Library with sponsorship from the foundation.



The Tan Chin Tuan Foundation Makes Possible New Scholarship at SIT

The Tan Sri (Dr) Tan Chin Tuan Scholarship at SIT encourages academic excellence and nurtures undergraduates who have made significant contributions to SIT or the community

As a dedicated philanthropic leader for community development and education in Singapore, The Tan Chin Tuan Foundation has contributed significantly to the nation's educational landscape. Recently, it once again made a commitment to nurture excellence among Singapore's youth by establishing the Tan Sri (Dr) Tan Chin Tuan Scholarship at the Singapore Institute of Technology (SIT).

From Academic Year (AY) 2017/18 onwards, five scholarships (valued at \$8,000 each) will be awarded annually to academically promising and well-rounded students from SIT-conferred degree or joint degree programmes.

The first batch of Tan Sri (Dr) Tan Chin Tuan Scholars at SIT was selected in February. Scholarship recipient and Hospitality Business student Ms Eunice Goh said she felt deeply grateful towards the Foundation, and also that the scholarship would help her to excel academically and lessen the financial burden on her family. "One day, I hope to work in a role where I can help children and senior citizens with their dietary needs. Receiving the scholarship has boosted my confidence that I can pursue my two passions of event management and nutrition and use them to impact society positively in future," shared Eunice.

The Tan Chin Tuan Foundation was established by the late banker and philanthropist Tan Sri (Dr) Tan Chin Tuan to share with society the rewards of a highly illustrious career. Tan Sri (Dr) Tan, a respected community leader of his time, rendered assistance to the deserving and provided services that helped uplift the less fortunate.




In line with TCTF's focus on education and community development, complimentary workshops in speech & drama, music and dance broadened the children's learning horizons.





Project Cheer

Project Cheer was started in 2008 as part of the Birth Centennial celebrations of TCTF's founder Tan Sri Tan. It was also to encourage TCTF's supported charities and beneficiaries to pay-it-forward by bringing cheer to the less privileged.

Since 2014, TCTF has partnered Anglo-Chinese Junior College (ACJC) for Project Cheer. Between 2016 and 2018, more than 430 ACJC students connected with 1,640 beneficiaries from TCTF-supported charities.

Anglo-Chinese JC: Developing community awareness

Three weeks after helping to organise a bonding session between the young and old in Singapore, Rohabh Garg was inspired to do more for his community in India.

Together with his family, the Anglo-Chinese Junior College (ACJC) student, 18, served food to the poor at a temple near his home in Madhavahalli in southern India last month.

The permanent resident said: "It was through my school's project that I became more aware of the needs of my community. So when I went back, I shared my experience with my family, and we decided to do something for the needy."

Community awareness and empathy were things Rohabh and his classmates had learnt after organising a charity event earlier last month. At the event, seven children from Asean Family Services and 42 seniors from O'Joy Care Centre interacted through joint activities such as making terrariums.

Mr Meyren Sek, 38, head of department for project work and volunteerism at ACJC, said: "At the JC level, we want the students to have a sense of ownership and responsibility, that initiative to start things and the tenacity to see it through."

The charity event was part of ACJC's Project Cheer, which was started in 2014 and had 12 student-led projects this year.

To learn about the needs of the children and elderly, Rohabh's team visited both Asean and the care centre to talk to the beneficiaries and staff. It took the JC class numerous Skype calls and proposals to get the day's events in order.

The class's teacher-mentor for the project, Ms Lye Kit Wan, 32, said: "The event itself might only be one day, but I think the students have picked up... certain values and skills that are lifelong."

Director of Asean Family Services Edwin Yim said: "Some of the children had a hard time bidding farewell to the elderly and exchanged high-fives."

Project leader Joel Tan, 18, said he realised he has not really spent time talking to his grandparents.

"I came to realise that I should really cherish the relationship with my grandma, and take the first step to help her more and give her the attention she wants with me."

Celebrating 5 Years of Cheerful Service



Building bonds

"With Cheer, We Bond" – This is the ethos of Project Cheer. An annual initiative by the Tan Chin Tuan Foundation (TCTF) in partnership with ACJC, it is meant to encourage our students to put their values in action to create positive experiences for both children and elderly who are underprivileged.

Besides offering an authentic opportunity for our students to hone their project management and leadership skills, Project Cheer allowed them to facilitate intergenerational bonding. For every project, the organising team would meet their partner organisations as well as identify suitable facilities and activities. After the project's execution, our students reflected on the process and the outcome. Our students truly learnt how much they have been blessed with. Yet, despite that,

they sometimes still feel that they do not have enough. It is only then that they truly appreciated how they will always need others if they are to bless others in turn.

In this year's Project Cheer, 230 students put their values into action by planning 11 Project Cheer sessions to bring cheer to 300 children and 400 elderly beneficiaries from May 28 to June 14. For each session, our students spent the morning with the children from their partner organisations to prepare them for the activities that they would conduct with the elderly later that day – such as designing personalised art pieces or rehearsing a song item. In the afternoon, our students then led these children on a special excursion to the senior activity centres to bring cheer to the elderly.

As Chng Zong Xian, the student leader for 2SC1 for Project Cheer observed, "Doing good should not be used as a way to forcefully show others your good nature and it should also not be used to expand your list of VIA records". Rather, he added "Your love for your community and the appreciation you show for your community through kind gestures do not require praise" but should "come from the heart". As long as you genuinely do your part for the community, no matter how big or small, it will certainly impact the lives we have touched.

At the Institute of Mental Health (IMH), TCTF's donation funded a dedicated exercise corner for patients from long-staying wards.



To support child survivors of trafficking and abuse, TCTF donated to the education and nutrition programme at **Hagar Community Learning Centre**. This enabled the recovering children to access primary education and receive meals.

Through the student-led humanitarian initiative by the **NUS Medical Society** called **Project Sa'Bai Vision**, there were about 980 free eye-screenings and medications for more than 200 villagers in Phnom Penh, using TCTF-sponsored medical supplies.

About 27 charities serving the aged, disabled and needy in various areas of Malaysia benefitted from the contributions of the foundation from 2016 to 2018.
